Compensation is available. The background of the individuals in need may be a physical or developmental disability, social and emotional challenges, and they may be in need of a time away from an escalating situation.

Necessary qualifications include:

- Having a caring and concerning ability to relate to others and their specific situations
- Having professional skills and demeanor
- Ability to work with the agency
- Ability to work with other members of the individual/family team
- Ability to write reports and document daily events
- Having the flexibility to work with crisis respite situations as well as for planned situations
